Fur Harvesters Auction Inc. is pleased to report that with the conclusion of our June 2026 auction the company officially sold for the highest gross sales in North Bay's History, shattering the previous record of 2013. Early on we did our best to inform trappers of where we saw the market heading and which species were expected to perform the best. Most will recall I reported that northern trappers that harvest Marten, Lynx, Bobcats and quality well handled beaver and wild mink should do very well as global interest is increasing steadily.

We are pleased that our predictions were true as in March 2026 Fur Harvesters sold Marten and Bobcats for the highest average prices in recorded history in a trade that has existed for hundreds of years. Wild mink which for over a decade was wallowing below ten dollars averaged over \$45.00 US.

At the closing of our June auction we saw beaver advance by 20% over March with a 100% clearance. Sables weakened 15% over March's record price and cleared at 99%. This puts this article now at a price point of the second highest in history. Wild mink averaged \$42 and cleared at 100%. Muskrats edged up over March levels as well clearing at 100%.

We made a point in mid winter to relay to trappers that all indications were pointing to another year like 2013 and on all northern species our results blew 2013 levels out of the water. What is important to note that it is common for many species to weaken in a June auction and the two large Russian auctions took place just before our June sale. The Russian Sable auctions had clearances of 50% and less and price levels down from February. This was not the case with our sale as we tried very hard to maintain the levels we set in March. This is a monumental undertaking when levels hit record highs.

Bobcats sold very strongly again but in the case of the top western cats we bought back about 40% of the top goods as we had more than the demand could handle. The levels we did sell top cats for was exactly as we did in March. The part lots sold very well across ALL section with a 95% clearance. We held to strong values on Lynx which saw us buying back the bigger sizes with better bellies.

When looking over the sales report in its entirety you will see almost all of the species we handle cleared at 100% or very close to it. The only two species that remain slow to increase is raccoon and coyotes but we are optimistic that 2027 could see this change.

What drives our bullish position looking to 2027 is the fact we had the largest buyer attendance ever for both 2026 auctions and the fact that 50% of the jammed auction room were new Asian buyers. Invoices are being paid fast and shipping ramped up directly the day following the auction.

The results on so many of these items now at historical high price levels proves one important thing and that is only by selling to a bustling packed auction room of International buyers can this happen.
